INSTRUMENT MUSIC LESSONS 2024-25

I am delighted to be able to offer instrumental tuition for your child in school. Tuition takes place during school hours using a rota system, to avoid students missing part of the same lesson each week. Students in the upper school have prioritised slots at break times and lunchtimes. Students in sixth form take lessons in their free periods.

Lessons are available to all students irrespective of their previous experience. We also have an enriching extra-curricular programme so that students can develop their instrumental skills. If students have instrumental lessons, it is expected that they take part in at least one extra-curricular ensemble.

The peripatetic staff are self-employed, so feedback and payment are arranged privately between parents and tutors. However, if your child is eligible for Pupil Premium funding, the school will pay the peripatetic invoices. The school does not generally provide instruments, but advice is always available about the most competitive purchase or rental schemes.

Lessons will be arranged through an online app called 'Practice Pal' and further details for how to use this will be forwarded to those who have signed up for lessons.

Terms and Conditions for Peripatetic music lessons at Urmston Grammar School 2024-25

- Tuition costs from September 2024 will be based on an hourly rate of **£39.00**. Most lessons are arranged for 20 minutes meaning a cost of **£13.00 per week**.
- An invoice for lessons will be sent home at the beginning of each half term. Payment is made directly to the instrumental tutor.
- Fees for missed lessons are not refunded unless absence is due to student illness. This should be reported to the tutor at the beginning of the day affected. The tutor should be advised about school trips and other appointments that are known in advance so that the weekly timetable can be changed. In these cases, the lesson fee will be credited.
- **Tutors and Ms Langham require at least 4 weeks' notice if lessons are to be terminated.**
- **Lessons will automatically continue during exam periods and study leave periods, as well as in the subsequent school year. Notice must be given in ANY circumstance when lessons are to stop.**
- Instruments remain the responsibility of the student and they must be kept in the allocated storage room in the music department or kept on the student's person. It is advisable that any musical instrument is covered by personal insurance. **Instrument cases must be clearly named.**
- Students who have lessons at school are expected to take part in organised music groups such as a choir and or band, as well as other small ensembles that may be arranged by instrumental tutors. This may involve performing in public concerts both in and out of school from time to time.

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
