We ensure that the process of learning is stimulating, challenging and exciting both inside and outside the classroom. Providing opportunities and encouraging participation

We believe passionately in giving all our students a well rounded education and are committed to developing the whole child. We encourage all students to participate in a wide a range of extra-curricular activities. If your child joins us, they will have the chance to play competitive sports, learn a new craft, take part in Duke of Edinburgh Expeditions, take on STEM Challenges, become BBC School Reporters and Sports Leaders, get involved in debating competitions, contribute to Reading Groups, and to participate in Cipher Challenges, Skiing and Snowboarding Clubs, Music Ensembles, Art workshops... the list goes on and on.

Our teachers have taken children on expeditions to the WW1 battlefields in Belgium and the ski slopes of Italy, as well as to countries as far flung as Costa Rica, Honduras, Iceland and Kenya. Our MFL Department lead trips to Paris and Munich, as well as exchange programmes. These trips develop our students' language skills and expose them to different cultures.

Continuing education: Sixth Form

Our Sixth Form is a fantastic choice for your child if they are currently in Year 11 at our school or at another school in the region. By retaining an emphasis on our core values, the Sixth Form provides a structured environment within which your child can flourish.

The Sixth Form has a reputation for academic success. We thoroughly prepare students for university and the working world and we regularly feature as one of the top state schools in the country in the A Level league tables. If your child joins our Sixth Form, they will enjoy enrichment, leadership and volunteering opportunities.
