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OPPORTUNITIES



Every year on 15 July, World Youth Skills Day celebrates the importance of equipping young people with the skills they need for employment, decent work and entrepreneurship.

The world of work is changing rapidly. Artificial intelligence, the green transition and growing social complexity are transforming how we learn, work and participate in society. To thrive in this changing landscape, young people need more than technical skills alone. They need a balanced set of competencies that combines technical, digital, AI, green, social-emotional and soft skills with the human qualities that technology cannot replace.



On 15th July at 9am, this webinar hosted by UNESCO-UNEVOC in Bonn, will bring together government representatives, educators, employers, youth networks, development partners and young people from around the world. The discussion will focus on a critical question: What will it take to equip every young person with the competencies they need to thrive in a shared future?



You will notice the term “TVET” used a lot on their website. This stands for Technical and Vocational Education and Training. It is a form of education focused on acquiring practical, hands-on skills and technical knowledge required for specific trades, occupations, or professions. In the UK, we have the following technical and vocational courses: Apprenticeships, BTecs, T Levels, V Levels. You can read more about these here.

A clinical coder translates medical information from patient records into standardised alphanumeric codes.

By reviewing doctors' notes and test results, they assign specific codes for diagnoses and treatments. This data is essential for hospital funding, medical research, and tracking public health.
