

Our teachers have taken children on expeditions to the WW1 battlefields in Belgium and the ski slopes of France, as well as to countries as far flung as Costa Rica, Honduras, Iceland and Kenya. Each year, we also run an exchange programme with our partner school in Lille and offer Year 9 students the opportunity to visit Germany. These trips develop our students' language skills and expose them to different cultures.


